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


## **NEW**, Student Toolkit

#### Make a Connection and Follow Up

After working to customize your resume for a position, crafting a cover letter, and completing an application, there is one more significant step that can greatly increase your chances of being considered for the role. Following the application process, work to find a contact within the organization to which you applied and reach out!

Immediately after submitting your application, send a note to the prospective employer, more specifically a recruiter or someone on the hiring committee expressing your genuine interest in the position, and excitement about the possible opportunity to speak further about the value you believe you can bring to the role.

#### How to find the appropriate contacts:

- · If applying within Handshake, you can typically find a contact listed on the company's Handshake profile page.
- · Consider looking for company contacts in Career Shift.
- · Utilize LinkedIn, by seeing if you are connected through your school or industry organizations.

We asked, Daniel Sanchez, a UNCW employee and recent August 2021 M.S. in Business Analytics graduate, a few questions about his experience going through the program and what's on the horizon. Here's what he had to share.

Why did you choose UNCW's Cameron School of Business for your program of study?

A few of my colleagues joined the same program, and I had heard great things about the program structure and pacing.

Did you have a favorite course/professor, can you tell us about them and why it stood out to you most?

All of the instructors were great, and they were willing to spend as much time with me as I needed. I loved any class that introduced me to new software - R, Python, SQL, Tableau. Most of the courses in the program featured at least one of these programs. I also enjoyed learning about more in-depth features of Excel.

How did you create your network with your fellow peers in the program and how do you plan to stay connected with them in future?

I've connected with my cohort on LinkedIn, and I've created online accounts for GitHub and YouTube. I plan on sharing my progress and connecting with my peers through those avenues.

What is next on the horizon for you and your career now that you have earned your advanced degree with UNCW?

I plan on continuing to learn and expand my skill set. Now that I have an understanding of the analytics tools available, I would like to practice using them more. I will continue to analyze data sets and create new visualizations, joining Kaggle competitions and LinkedIn challenges.

As you look back on your experience from day one of your first class, to where you are now, what advice would you now give to yourself (or another student) first starting the program?

What really helped me was finding a specific time of the week (preferably earlier in the week) to get the work mostly done. If you can knock out the lectures and at least start the assignment early, you will learn more by the end of the week.

#### What?

MSBA Pods provide an opportunity for MSBA students and alumni to meet, network, and socialize outside of the online class environment. After you enroll in the MSBA Pods your name and email address will be shared with the other members of your Pod. You may remain in your Pod after graduation if you wish.
