Consulting Project in Prague

This past May, twenty-seven and Online Executive MBA students from UNCW, along with three students from the University of Surrey, completed their international consulting Prague, project in Czech Republic. Over five days the team developed and presented recommendations to KOH-I-NOOR HARDTMUTH. а manufacturer of stationery products. KOH-I-NOOR wants to revamp their operations in Latin America through an ESG (Environmental, Social, and focused Governance) operating modality. So, the company turned to our graduate students to develop a P-E-S-T (Political, Economic, and Social, Technology) analysis for the vast Latin American market.

and to provide an overall strategic ESG strategy KOHN-I-NOOR can use in Latin America and as a model for future African and Asian expansions.

The team was led by Dr. Victoria Hansen (UNCW Professor of Accountancy). She was joined by Dr. Judith Gebauer (UNCW- Professor of IS) Mr. Chris Mahon and (Surrey-MBA Director). Dr. Hansen reflected on the residency saying, "This incredible experience offered students the opportunity to not only apply what they have learned throughout the MBA program to a real-world client, but it also provided them experience working with a diverse group of teammates on a global client which had a very different cultural background."

The CSB EMBA Program was fortunate to work in partnership David Dvorsky and Pavlina Dvorska with GIOBA Consulting Programs to orchestrate this educational opportunity. Students were able to apply the education they received from coursework as well as their professional strengths and experiences to a real-world consulting project.

Are international business professionals in demand?

With all the uncertainty brought by the pandemic, it will be hard to find career paths with futures as secure as those within international business, with the US Bureau of Labor Statistics projecting a growth as high as 30% within the next decade. The significant growth in these careers is due to the confluence of a number of trends: (1) continued trend toward globalization, (2) emerging markets from Asia, Latin America, and Africa offering untapped customer bases and expanding middle-class populations with rising purchasing power, (3) growth of cross-border trade fueled by international policies trending toward free trade agreements, (4) the digital revolution streamlining cross-border communications and international team collaborations, and (5) an increasing focus on managing responsible and sustainable international supply chains.

Why choose a concentration in International Business?

Incorporating coursework in international business offers numerous benefits, including (1) developing a global perspective increasingly valuable in today's interconnected world, (2) the increasing prevalence of multinational corporations brings an increased demand for professionals with the knowledge to work effectively in such organizations by being able to manage cross-cultural teams, develop international marketing strategies, oversee sustainable global supply chains, etc., and (3) increasing your competitive potential for global positions and/or leadership positions in multinational corporations.

Are there opportunities for professional development?

Should you decide to pursue a career path in international business now or in the future, I would encourage you to take advantage of other professional opportunities to deepen your expertise and build your credibility.
